The tendency is to stop and pause when approaching the double set of glass doors separating the two zones. But, if you keep moving forward through the first set of doors, the second set will automatically open. In the same way, as COCHUSA transitions to its future, I challenge you, "Don't Stop ... Keep Moving Forward" in five (5) key areas:

The MOVEMENT: Our Inception

The MOVEMENT: Our Inception (Con'd)

"Reopening & Consecration of State-of-the Art Mother Church"

The *Reopening & Consecration Service* of Christ Temple Church in Jackson MS—the Mother Church -- was held on Wednesday, May 22, 2024. This facility is located on the founding site that Bishop Charles Price Jones established the Holiness Movement and the Church of Christ (Holiness) USA.



This special service was the culmination of Phase 1 of the South Central Diocese and Bishop Glake Hill-led major renovation of this facility that's vital to the Diocese and National Church.

After the renovations, the building is now positioned to be a leading church facility within the city of Jackson and National Church. With renovations performed to the amount of \$500,000, the Mother Church has new parking lot surface to facility safe and larger gatherings. Restrooms and infrastructure have been updated to provide quality to those in attendance. Water and drainage issues were addressed, and air conditioning heating was improved. The Pulpit was enlarged, and new furniture was added to modernize the setup.

The technology was vastly improved. A state-of-the-art sound system was installed with increased number of microphones and directed array speakers. Spotlights and ambient light were added for effects. Four PTX cameras were added for live stream and video production. Finally, a 10' x 16' LED screen was added for viewing in the sanctuary. This screen is 4K compatible with the potential to 8K with available. *Great job, Bishop Hill and the SCD!*



The METRICS: Our Indicators

One-Year Membership Decline ('Some Concern')

After last year's modest membership increase of **114** or **1%**, membership decreased this year by **-368** (from **11**,366 to 10,998) or **-3%**. However, most -- though not all -- of this year's declines can be traced to corrections or miscalculations from last year. This 'reduced-alarm' assessment seems to be supported by the 'record high' of **27** local churches that grew by **7%** or more in 2023-2024. (See "Local Churches That Grew By 7% or More" on Page **6**.)



So, overall, we *salute* the two (2) dioceses that numerically grew this year. The **Northern Diocese** increased by **58** members (from 1,340 to 1,398) or **4%**. And the **Northcentral Diocese** grew by **63** members (from 251 to 314) or **25%**.



Eight+ Years Trend ('Much Concern'

But, the **8-year trend** (2016-2024) presents a starker reality. During this era, membership declined by **-2,700** (from 13,698 to 10,998) or **-20%**. Of course, the pandemic affected not only COCHUSA's world – but the entire world! During this **8-year span**, all Dioceses experienced declines of double-digit percentages -- except two. Our largest diocese, **South Central Diocese** experienced only a small decline of **-4%** (from 4,605 to 4,439). And the **North Central Diocese** grew by **7%** (from 293 to 314).


Five-Year Uptick In National Ministry Fund

When it comes to ministry, people tend to vote with their "feet" and "finances." Post-pandemic, fewer 'feet' have been showing up in some – but not all-- churches. **But God has** been blessing our churches – and COCHUSA – financially this past year!

Led by the **South Central Diocese** achieving a record high of **\$200,322**, this year's National Ministry Fund of **\$490,967** is a near 15-year high; second only to **2006** (base year of \$509,882) and **2013** (\$493,864).



In addition to the **South Central Diocese**, the following five (2) Dioceses are commended for single-double digit percentage increases in this key metric: **Eastern Diocese**; **Northcentral Diocese**; **Pacific Northwest Diocese**, **Southwestern Diocese**; and **the Southeastern Diocese**.

First COCHUSA African American Church Evangelism Cohort Graduates

Praise God! In December, COCHUSA received a \$300,000 grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. This COCHUSA's largest grant in our 127-year history! The purpose is to help establish "COCHUSA FORWARD," the newest church revitalization initiative launched by the **National Church Evangelism and Mission Board** (NCE&MB), Bishop H. Vonzell Castilla, Chairman.



cochusa Forward will support congregations in expanding their post-pandemic engagement capacities by developing and partnering in outwardly focused ministries. With a view towards re-igniting the zeal for the missional mandates of scripture, Pastors and congregants will create collaborative networks designed to serve the church and community in a post-pandemic era.

Says Bishop Castilla, "Our people, especially our young adults, want to be a part of a church which addresses the unique issues facing our communities,

1. Are there restrictions on how funds may be used?

Answer: Yes, the funds may only be used to help designated churches thrive post COVID in accordance with the proposal and budget approved by the Lily Endowment.

2. How will the money be spent?

Answer: - Personnel and Administrative Staff - Administrative and Travel Costs

- Missional Outreach Projects - Church Leaders/Teams Meeting Costs

- Church Technological Upgrades

3. How many churches will be able to participate and receive resources?

Answer: Initially, thirteen (13) participating churches:

-7 from the South Central Diocese

-6 from the Southwestern Diocese

*Eventually 26-30 churches including other Dioceses will be selected to participate over four-year period.

4. How will participating churches benefit from being in the cohort?

Answer: Participating churches will thrive numerically, financially and relationally ("inreach" and community outreach) because of participation in the cohort.

5. How were/ will the churches be chosen?

Answer: The Presiding Bishop of the diocese is empowered to make the selection.



'The MOUNTAIN': Our Intimacy With God

Tim Keller was 'spot on' when he declared that "Prayer is awe before an infinite force, and yet it's intimacy with a personal friend." Did you notice the connection between prayer and intimacy?

Prayer -- at its best -- is not the time where we 'intimate' or order God concerning what we want. But rather, prayer is a time where we experience 'intimacy' with God – and what He wants!

And so, my ultimate heart's desire for COCHUSA is that we "Don't Stop, but Keeping Moving Forward" by scaling the



'Mountain Place' called "Intimacy with God." Or stated another way, personal holiness is not so much about what we "don't" do.



To be clear, there are some things we "shouldn't" do! For as J. C. Ryle well stated, "Backsliding, generally first begins with neglect of private prayer."

But at the heart of Biblical holiness is 'what' – and Who – we do pursue.

As we pursue the *Great Commission* "To Go ..." (Matthew 28:20), let's not neglect the *Great Commandment* "To Know Him ... Intimately" (Matthew 22:37)!

May I share the insights of Daniel Henderson one last – or one more -- time: "If all we ever do is seek God's hand, we may miss His face; but if we seek His face, He will be glad to open His (hand) and satisfy the deepest desires of our hearts."
